Course Description: The overriding purpose of this course is to provide students with a theoretical framework for analyzing the evolution of modern military institutions and the people who lead them. Students will examine the development of the military profession in the United States from the War of Independence through the 1990s. Students will examine contemporary concepts of military professionalism by studying the careers of American officers in their historical context. This course will also address the major European influences that revolutionized standards of officer procurement, training, education, and advancement in the United States and around the world.

- Semester Grade: The student's final grade will be based on the total number of points (900 total) earned in oral reports and class discussion (200 points), a tentative bibliography (100 points) an annotated bibliography (200 points), and an analytical paper (400 points). Class attendance and participation will also affect the grade. The professor reserves the right to fail any student who misses two or more classes without prior permission or valid excuses.

This class will proceed along the lines of a colloquium or proseminar. Each student will have to read from a list of common readings, as well as eight different biographies or autobiographies. Class meeting will be utilized for background lectures by the professor, as well as discussion periods to explore the students' common and individual readings.

The biographies and autobiographies approved for this class are grouped into four historical periods. Each student will select and read two books from Group I, two from Group II, two from Group III, and two from Group IV. To provide the class with as wide a scope as possible, students must not read the same biographies as their classmates. Students may feel free to concentrate on officers who belonged to a specific branch of the armed forces (i.e., U.S. Army or U.S. Navy). Those interested in air power will have to read about Army officers from Groups I and II. Those interested in the Marine Corps will not find enough Marine biographies in the earlier periods. They may fill out their bibliographies with biographies of Navy officers.

Students desiring an \underline{A} for a final grade are advised to supplement their required reading with some titles dealing with the development of military professionalism in the United States (see the section labeled **SUPPLEMENTARY READING**).


Analytical Paper: At the end of the semester, each student will submit a paper (a minimum of twenty-five typewritten pages, not counting bibliography and endnotes) that will constitute the main graded assignment for the course. In this paper, the student will attempt to trace the development of the American military profession through the lives of the eight officers he or she read about (plus whatever other material he or she read for the class). While describing the changes in professional standards reflected in the lives of various American officers, students must also address how well their respective subjects measured up to the standards of their day and our own. The student should also analyze the books he or she has read, not only in terms of their scholarship, but also as to whether they successfully engaged the broader themes that turn the lives of selected individuals

into windows for viewing the development of the American military.
